The Village of Marwayne secures Federal funding for Walking Trails and a Splash Park at Westview Park

The Village of Marwayne has secured additional funding for the Walking Trails and Splash Park through the Canada Community Revitalization Fund (CCRF). The Village of Marwayne has received \$375,000 in federal funding to go towards these projects as a means of expanding our community's recreational amenities for residents and visitors alike. "Our government is making investments that transform community infrastructure into modern gathering places for residents of all ages through the Canada Community Revitalization Fund. Today's support to establish this new community recreation space in Marwayne will help create a welcoming place where residents and visitors can connect to enjoy the outdoors." *The Honourable Daniel Vandal, Minister for PrairiesCan*

The Canada Community Revitalization Fund (CCRF) is a two-year, \$500 million national infrastructure program to help communities like the Village of Marwayne rebound from the COVID-19 pandemic. The fund assists non-profit organizations, municipalities, community groups, and Indigenous communities across Canada to build and improve community infrastructure projects. PrairiesCan administers the CCRF in Alberta. "The Village of Marwayne is eager to break ground on the splash park and walking trails this summer. Thanks to the Canada Community Revitalization Fund, we are now able to move ahead with projects that have been on the drawing board for years. We look forward to celebrating this achievement once construction is complete and have the opportunity to relish with our fellow citizens over the beautiful amenities our community stands to benefit from for years to come." **Chris Neureuter, Mayor for the Village of Marwayne**

The Splash Park will be constructed in Westview Park in the spring/summer of 2022, located in between the soccer fields and the playground. The design will be suitable for all ages and abilities, with multiple pieces of equipment for everyone to enjoy. As for the walking trails, these will extend upon our current trajectory to allow for better pedestrian traffic within our boundaries and ease of access to our various Village amenities. Our goal is that the construction of the Splash Park and Walking Trails will enhance our residents' quality of life, draw in visitors and help local businesses during the peak season by encouraging more people to shop in their stores, dine in their restaurants and further enjoy their experience in the small rural Village of Marwayne. "Trails, parks, and public spaces across Alberta communities bring people together and support countless small businesses. 
COUNCIL HIGHLIGHT

- Council approved the 2022 Capital and Operational Budgets at the May 9th Council Meeting. Given the
 rising costs of service provision, contracted services and a decline in provincial and federal grant funding,
 Council increased this years budget to \$488,467 from \$458,671 in 2021.
- Council passed Bylaw No. 588-22 to authorize the rates of taxation to be levied against assessable property for the 2022 taxation year and impose a penalty on all taxes remaining unpaid. The minimum tax rate was increased to \$950, the residential mill rate to 10.5 and the non-residential mill rate to 14.6.
- Council also passed Bylaw No. 589-22 to authorize the annual special culture and recreation rates of taxation to be levied against all properties for the Marwayne Agriplex Debenture Payments. The amount of \$74.60 was levied against all properties within the Village of Marwayne.
- Property taxes are due on or before June 30th, 2022. On the 1st day of July 2022, a penalty of 12% will be applied and added to any taxes not paid by the deadline. On the 1st day of January 2023, a further penalty of 6% will be applied and added to any taxes not paid on or before December 31st, 2022.
- Should you be missing a copy of your tax notice, please contact the Village administration office. Failure to receive your tax notice does not omit you from your responsibility to pay your municipal property taxes. No exceptions will be granted so we encourage you to remit your payment on time!



HONOUR FATHER

June is the month that we honour and remember fathers. A father has a great responsibility in the role modelling of the Man image. They are teacher, provider, fixer and need to be both strong and yet kind and compassionate and a good listener. In their strength, they are a safe place, not a place of fear or harshness. They are to be a balance of strength/gentleness and teacher/learner and fixer yet know their own limits. This is a big role to fill and some fathers will be remembered for being a positive role model while others will be remembered for more of a harsh presence. In June, there can be an opportunity to reflect on the positive good memories but also a time to deal with the negative relationships that are still causing mental anguish. Often the stuffed down emotions are the cause of grief, pain, hurt and anger, which can continue to have effects generation after generation. Giving these emotion a "name" and a space for reflection can help with addressing these effects. An additional step can be finding a safe person to share your experiences. A family member friend, or trusted other may support you in being honest about what you are feeling and where these feelings are harbored. Emotions such as disappointment, fear, rejection, abandonment, isolation and more are the fuel that fires your Volcano. So perhaps this is the "Father's Day" to move forward, empty the stuffed bag and release, and maybe even to forgive so you can know freedom.

If you seek to honour your father during a period of grief, this can also pose questions about how to address the inevitable emotion. When the world is turned upside down and inside out the strongest of men can be shaken by the death of a parent, child, spouse, family member, friend or a relationship that ceases and is broken. When we feel like our dreams have also died, there is the thought of what the future might have been or what the past could have been. When losses are experienced one is left vulnerable and naked, so to speak. IF you are grieving the loss of your father during this Father's Day, you may wonder how can strength be modeled in the midst of such loss and pain.

The myth in society is that *big boys don't cry* and *tough it out*. That is an impossible demand when one's heart is broken.

It is known there are different grieving patterns between man and woman and many factors that affect how one grieves. Take heart, there is no one way to grieve nor is there a right or wrong way or specific time to be *over grieving*. There are good coping skills one can learn so that there is no need to stay stuck on the grief journey.

Never be afraid to reach out and learn some skills to help heal and become healthy and whole again. Don't stuff your emotions but find a healthy way to work through your grief, there is strength is what you may believe appears weakness.

Find understanding friends, read, and seek out a counsellor or support group.

Refrain from self medicating with substances for it only delays the grief process. A process that will need to be dealt with, sometimes years later.

Find some routine in the out of control world.

Your loss and grief is unique and cannot be compared to anyone else's (your personality, other loses, coping mechanisms, age, attitude social supports, and the acceptance of the myth of expectations that MAN is strong and without emotions)

Commit to doing "grief work"

Is Grief Work hard? Yes, it's the hardest work you will ever do but it is worth it to become healthy and whole, and role model all aspects of what it means to be a man and father.



The official start of summer is the summer solstice, which happens on June 21st. Long days make June the month in which most plant growth takes place---the leaves on the trees... grass... gardens... crops.

The month of May and the first part of June have us scrambling to "get the seeds in the ground" to take advantage of the long hours of sunlight needed for that growth. When we finally get them in, then we can watch as God does his "thing".

Jesus said, "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. All by itself the soil produces grain---first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head..." (Mark 4:26-28).

The fruit, grain, and vegetables grow automatically, that is, without human effort. The popular expectation at the time of Jesus was that God's kingdom would come suddenly and all at once.
