Council passes 2020 Utility Rate Bylaw Amendment

At the January 20th, 2020 Regular Meeting of Council, the Village of Marwayne passed Bylaw No. 576-20 to amend Schedule A of the Fees and Charges for Goods and Services Bylaw No. 544-15. The amendment was done in order to adjust the 2020 Utility Rates for residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, public building and bulk water, sewer and/or garbage users alike. The table set forth below, which is also available on www.marwayne.ca, outlines the fees for services for the 2020 calendar year. Any questions related to these changes may be directed to the Village administration office.

ATTENTION SENIORS—IMPORTANT CHANGES TO YOUR ALBERTA HEALTH BENEFIT COVERAGE

Spouse and dependants of Alberta seniors, changes are coming to the Alberta Coverage for Seniors program. Alberta Health has commenced mailing out letters to individuals who are registered as a dependant of a senior enrolled in the coverage for the Senior's program. These letters must be addressed immediately. The letter explains clearly what will be required from you and the necessary steps to ensure you will continue to have health benefit coverage as of March 1, 2020. Keep a copy of all documentation regarding your choice of health benefit coverage for your files.

Effective March 1, 2020, seniors' family members who are younger than 65 years will no longer be eligible to receive benefits from the Alberta Health Benefit Coverage for Seniors, from their spouse or partner. Any questions regarding these changes can be relayed to the Town of Vermilion.

THE ABILITY TO LOVE REQUIRES THE NECESSITY TO MOURN

It is said “Little Love” requires little pain, but “Great Love” requires great pain. You may beginning a journey that is often frightening, painful and sometimes lonely, it is the Grief journey. No words written or kind words said can take the pain away.

When someone you love dies, or a life loss occurs, the emotion of love necessitates that you mourn and embrace the pain of grief. Grief cannot be denied, minimized or escaped. “ You must feel it to heal it”. You must do the work of grief by mourning (the outward expression of the inward grief pain).

Grief is a process not an event and so it will take time for healing to occur. Be patient and gentle with yourself , the pain will lessen in time. Remember each person's journey is uniquely theirs and will be felt and dealt with in their own unique way.

There are some social “Myths” held ; that if you are controlled and rational all the time you are doing well, that if you openly express your grief you are thought to be over emotional, that you should get over the loss and grief as soon as possible, that crying is a sign of weakness . Actually , the tears allow your grief would to start healing .

Denying the loss or the pain and brokenness because of the death of someone you have loved or the life loss you have experienced that has changed you forever will not make the pain go away. Accepting and embracing the pain and moving through the pain helps with the healing and reconciling your grief.

Death may separate you but love will never go away. Memories live on.

Share thoughts and feelings and memories with a compassionate listener.

Understand each person has a unique journey and time table for their grief journey.

Circumstances and how you do your grief work by embracing the pain and finding resources to support.
