January 13th to the 21st, 2020.



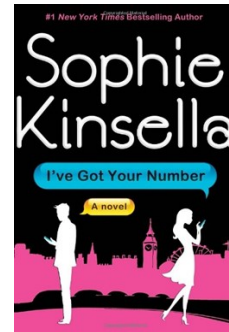
