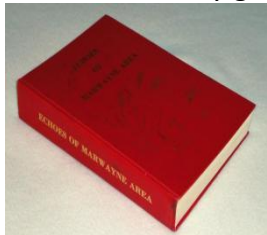

Highlights from November and December Marwayne Village Council Meetings

From Council's 2018-2019

Organization Meeting:

Cheryle Eikeland was acclaimed as Mayor for another year. Mayor Eikeland called for nominations for the Office of Deputy Mayor. Councillors Lawrence, Neureuter, and Rainey were all nominated.

A vote was held and Ashley Rainey was declared the Village's Deputy Mayor for 2018-2019.

Resolution: 2018-11-20

In order for the Village of Marwayne to receive Alberta Central East Water Corp. (ACE) treated water, the Village had to sign a Water Supply Agreement with ACE. After all of Council's questions and concerns were addressed, they passed a resolution to sign the agreement. It is anticipated that Marwayne will begin to receive treated water from ACE in January 2019.

Resolution: 2018-11-26

The Village of Marwayne operates on the calendar year, with the year-end set for December 31. In order to continue operating until the budget and tax rate bylaw are adopted in the Spring, Council has to adopt an interim operating budget. Here's a brief snapshot of what was passed by resolution:

SNOW REMOVAL
