FIRE PREVENTION WEEK - October 6 to 13th, 2019

Every year, the majority of fire deaths in North America happen at home. Home fires today burn faster than ever. In a typical home fire, occupants may have as little as one to two minutes to escape safely from the time the smoke alarm sounds.

Home Fire Escape Planning - Home fire escape planning and drills are an essential part of fire safety. A "Home Fire Escape Plan" needs to be developed and practiced before a fire strikes.

A home escape plan should include the following:

- Two exits from every room in the home – usually a door and a window

- Properly installed and working smoke alarms

- A meeting place outside in front of the home where everyone will meet after they exit

- A call to 9-1-1 or the local emergency number from a cell phone or a neighbor's phone

Smoke Alarms - Smoke alarms detect and alert people to a fire in the early stages. Smoke alarms can mean the difference between life and death in a fire.

- Working smoke alarms cut in half the risk of dying in a home fire.

- Install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement.

- Test smoke alarms at least once a month using the test button.

- Make sure everyone in the home understands the sound of the smoke alarm and knows how to respond.

- Change the batteries in your smoke alarm yearly

Cooking - Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries. The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is unattended cooking.

- Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food.

- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly and stay in the home.

- Keep anything that can catch fire away from your stovetop.

Heating - Heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fires during the winter months.

- Space heaters are the type of equipment most often involved in home heating equipment fires.

- All heaters need space. Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet (1 metre) away from heating equipment.

- Have a 3-foot (1 metre) "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters

- Purchase and use only portable space heaters listed by a qualified testing laboratory.

- Have a qualified professional install heating equipment.

- Maintain heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected by a qualified professional.

REMEMBERING ALONE

October 15th is a time set aside across the country to *remember* and support those families who have experienced the pain and grief of; miscarriage, stillbirth, infant loss due to SIDS and other causes. This is a time to remember the loss that took a little treasure, a little angel far too soon. Often this is a time that remembering becomes a lonely journey, as those around are uncomfortable with how to support grieving families. There often is a stigma around the loss of someone the community never got to know, and those who have suffered such a great loss may feel that they don't have a right to grieve.

This is a time for community to become aware of those who grieve and "seek to understand" the impact of such a loss for parents and also siblings.

For you the parents, we honour you as you remember the anticipation of being a parent to now having empty arms. This has become the beginning of an emotional "roller coaster"; anger, fear, guilt, blame, depression anxiety and so much more. You have experienced one of life's greatest losses and you "grieve".

Some thoughts: Your grief will take time to work through, it is a journey you must make and hopefully you will have found those who will journey with you.

Take care of yourself.- Eat well and get plenty of rest so you can continue to heal emotionally.

Express yourself in a way that fits who you are- Find that safe person to talk about your feelings, fears, and your grief. Journal or find a special project that has meaning for you. This can be a release for the bottled feelings inside.

Explore available resources – There are books, articles, poems and information on the Internet and support groups available.

Build your support network- It may be family and friends or faith community. You may want to contact a support group for parents who have had similar loss to be able to share your story and learn from others about their coping skills.

Try to be understanding of partners needs- There may be times it is difficult to comfort each other. Be sensitive to their needs and find others you can lean on in difficult times helps.

REMEMBER: Oct 15th - Light a candle in remembrance of so many who have lost so much. There is something special about *light*. Light helps us see past darkness and light gives hope in that darkness, and that there is a future.

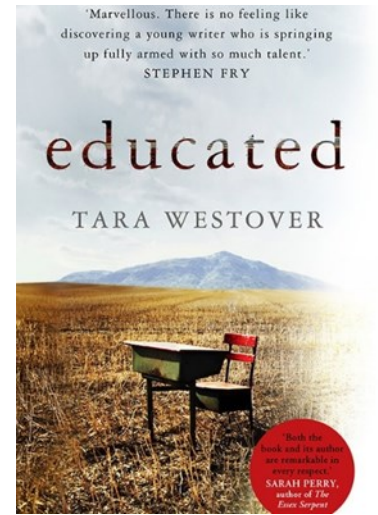

Public Sale of Land (Municipal Government Act) Village of Marwayne

Notice is hereby given that, under the provisions of the Municipal Government Act, Village of Marwayne will offer for sale, by public auction, in the Village of Marwayne Administration Office, 210 2nd Avenue South, Marwayne, Alberta on Thursday, October 24, 2019, at 10:00 a.m., the following parcels:

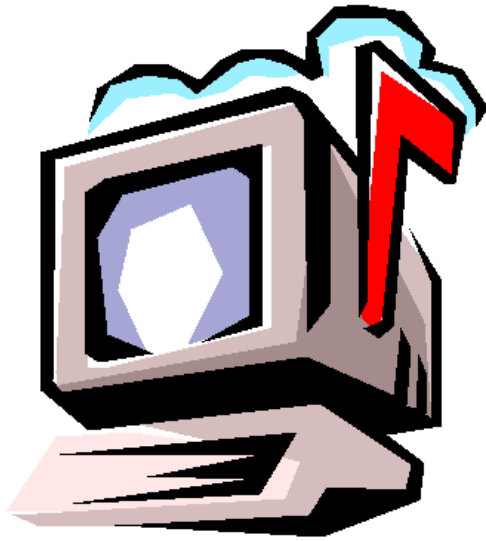

1. A parcel of land offered for sale may be redeemed by payment of all arrears, penalties and costs by guaranteed funds at any time until the property is declared sold.
2. Each parcel of land offered for sale will be subject to a reserve bid and to the reservations and conditions contained in the existing certificate of title.
3. The lands are being offered for sale on an "as is, where is" basis, and the municipality makes no representation and gives no warranty whatsoever as to the state of the parcel nor its suitability for any intended use by the successful bidder.
4. The auctioneer, councilors, the chief administrative officer and the designated officers and employees of the municipality must not bid or buy any parcel of land offered for sale, unless directed by the municipality to do so on behalf of the municipality.
5. The purchaser of the property will be responsible for property taxes for the current year.
6. The purchaser will be required to execute a sale agreement in form and substance provided by the municipality.
7. The successful purchaser must, at the time of sale, make payment in cash, certified cheque or bank draft payable to the municipality as follows:
 - A. The full purchase price if it is \$10,000 or less; OR
 - B. If the purchase price is greater than \$10,000, the purchaser must provide a non-refundable deposit in the amount of \$10,000 and the balance of the purchase price must be paid within 20 days of the sale.
1. GST will be collected on all properties subject to GST.
2. The risk of the property lies with the purchaser immediately following the auction.
3. The purchaser is responsible for obtaining vacant possession.
4. The purchaser will be responsible for registration of the transfer including registration fees.
5. If no offer is received on a property or if the reserve bid is not met, the property cannot be sold at the public auction.
6. The municipality may, after the public auction, become the owner of any parcel of land that is not sold at the public auction.
7. Once the property is declared sold at public auction, the previous owner has no further right to pay the tax arrears.


