Council passes 2019 Property Tax Bylaw



Bylaw 570-19 was passed on Monday, April 29 authorizing the rates of taxation to be levied against assessable property in the municipality for the 2019 year.

The Council elected to lower the revenue required from residential general municipal taxation to balance Marwayne's 2019 budget. The Mill Rate is similar to that of last year (7.930 to 7.934), the decline in total residential assessment of \$764,460 and the lowering of the minimum per parcel levy from \$829 down to \$750, has the Village bringing in, and operating on, less tax dollars than last year.

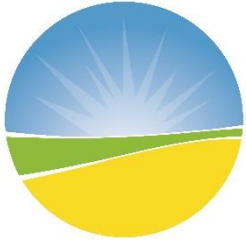
In addition, Council also passed Bylaw 571-19 authorizing the levying of an annual special recreation tax of \$74.60 on all lots to match the debt requirements on the debenture the Village has on the Marwayne Agriplex (Community Hall). The long term debt will have payments 16 and 17 of 40 made in 2019, with the balance owing currently at \$209,147.54 and has a maturity date of March 15, 2031.

Treasure Hunt Saturday, May 11 One day only

Here's how it works: *Treasure Hunt* is for reusable items! That stuff you know is still good but you don't want anymore, well let's recycle this stuff instead of taking it to the landfill. The *treasure hunt* is your opportunity to recycle appliances, furniture and other large items that can be re-used by someone else. Put your *treasures* on your FRONT Boulevard on May 11th. Residents are encouraged to *tour* around town looking for *treasures* to take home and the best part is they are free! The following are some ideas of acceptable items of what could be a reusable item please put sign on the item if they are not in working order: Fridges, Stoves, Washers, Dryers, Freezers, Furniture, Couches, Mattresses, Tables, Chairs, Sinks, Toilets, Dishwashers, Snow blowers, Lawnmowers, Swing sets, Patio furniture, Barbecues, Windows, Doors, Bikes, Wheelbarrows

Do not put out regular garbage, renovation materials, or your yard clean up bags as these will NOT be picked up. Place item in your front boulevard area, as this is the only location the *treasure hunters* will be *touring*!

Now what??? You have all these items on your boulevard; do you have to haul them away if they weren't taken?

No. That's where the second component comes into play:



Big item Pick up

Here's how it works: Leave your **reusable** items out on your boulevard. Public works will come around Monday, May 13 to assess what needs to be hauled to the dump. To save time and money the men will only assess and pick up off a street once so be sure to have your items out by 8 am May 13. Remember we WILL NOT pick up anything that can be placed in your large waste bins. This is ONLY for your **REUSABLE Big Items** not your leaves from raking etc. During this week (yes, your **treasures/junk** could be on your boulevard for a few days) the public works gang will take all the fridges, stoves, couches, freezers, sinks, etc. and dispose of them in the proper places at the landfill site.

Do you have broken furniture or appliances, old mattresses, or any other non-reusable large or heavy household items you can't get to the dump? Have these items at the boulevard by Monday, May 13th and they will be hauled away for you. Acceptable items for collection might include: Fridges, Stoves, Washers, Dryers, Furniture, and Used Mattresses, Sinks, Toilets, Barbeques, Snow blowers, Lawn mowers, Air Conditioners, Water Coolers, Metal and Propane Bottles, E-Waste, including, All-in-one printer/faxes, Televisions (of all sizes), PAINT IN ITS ORIGINAL CONTAINER.

Items that are NOT accepted and will not be picked up by the village are: Shingles, GYP ROC, Cement/concrete, Car parts or motors of any kind, Animal Waste, items that can be put into your regular garbage bin.

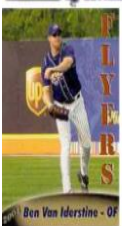

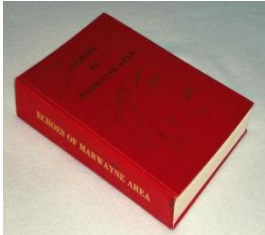

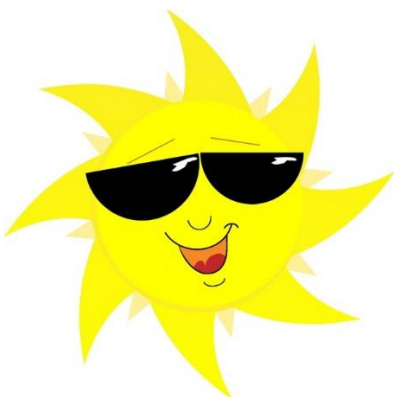

You will receive your 2020 tax assessment notice in the mail in May. Taxes are due June 30, 2019. If you do not receive a notice, contact the Village Office.

Taxes are due whether you received a notice or not.

Now is the time sign up for the pre-authorized payment plan through the Village Office. On the plan, your taxes will be automatically deducted from your bank account monthly. Sign up for the 2020-year before January to take advantage of the pre-authorized payment plan.
