What matters to you in the Village of Marwayne? Is it our recreational spaces, the need for more activities for young people, the improvement of services for the aging population, the maintenance of our road network or ensuring that local businesses can thrive? If you answered yes to any of these questions, becoming a Councillor for the Village of Marwayne may be the right fit for you.

Councillors are elected to represent the residents of their local community. As a Councillor, you are tasked with making important decisions related to budgeting, infrastructure, economic development and much more. Being a Councillor is both a rewarding and privileged form of public service as you are in a position to make a difference to the quality of people's daily lives and ensure the prosperity of the place you call home. To be eligible to run for Council, you must reside within the municipal boundary of the Village of Marwayne and not have any outstanding monies owing to the municipality.

As a Councillor for the Village of Marwayne, you must: Consider the welfare and interests of the municipality as a whole and bring to Council's attention anything that would promote the welfare or interests of the municipality; Promote an integrated and strategic approach to intermunicipal land use planning and service delivery with neighboring municipalities; Participate generally in developing and evaluating the policies and programs of the municipality; Participate in Council meetings and Council committee meetings and meetings of other bodies to which they are appointed by the Council; Obtain information about the operation or administration of the municipality from the CAO or person designated by the CAO; Keep in confidence matters discussed in private at a Council or Council committee meeting until discussed at a meeting held in public; Adhere to the code of conduct established by the Council; and Perform any other duty or function imposed on Councillors under the MGA, any other enactment or by the Council.

The required forms to run for the office of Councillor for the Village of Marwayne are readily available by visiting our website at www.marwayne.ca, or in person at the Village administration office. All relevant paperwork must be submitted to the Village administration office in person by November 14th, 2022 at 12:00pm (noon). The next municipal by-election will be held on December 12th, 2022.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHT

- Council accepted the resignation of Councillor Morgan Wood on August 15th, 2022. As such, the Village of Marwayne has a vacancy for an elected official to serve on Council for the remaining three (3) year term. Council and administration would like to sincerely thank Morgan Wood for his time spent serving his community and wish him all the best in his future endeavors.
- Council approved a variety of policies including the Drug and Alcohol Policy SA28, Roadway Signage Inspection Policy PW05, Sale of Soil, Sand and Gravel Policy PW02, Sidewalk, Trail and Curb/Gutter Inspection Policy PW04 and the Traffic Control Device Placement Policy PW06.
- The County of Vermilion River approved Council's request for funding towards the Marwayne Fire Hall Addition. County Council has graciously agreed to provide the Village of Marwayne with a \$50,000 contribution toward the project costs in January of 2023. The County also approved the purchase of a new tanker for the Marwayne Fire Department at a cost of \$462,000. A big thank you goes out to the County of Vermilion River for their willingness to work together to maintain and improve our shared protective services facilities and equipment!

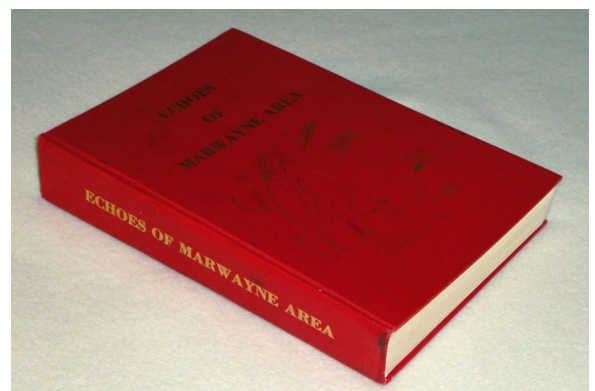

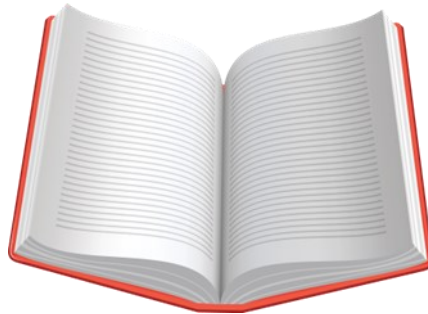

A SUPPORTIVE CIRCLE

Many hearts are broken and often the grieving is done in silence. The families that have dreams and hopes dashed by the loss through pregnancy or as an infant often are overlooked in their grief. Often the community does not know or are uncomfortable in supporting them and there are the myths that one only grieves the loss of child that a relationship has been developed with.

A day has been set aside in Canada and the U.S. to remember those families and the little one who has left their family. **October 9th to 15th is Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Week .**

October the 15th is the day set aside to honor the families and their special baby.

It is encouraged that each person remembers these families by lighting a candle at 7 p.m. on the 15th as others do all across Canada.

Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day is a day to break the silence around the loss as thousands of families across Canada are mourning the loss of their babies (present loss and losses remembered from the past). This loss is experienced as a result of miscarriage, stillbirth, and death within a year. The experience of pregnancy and infant loss is different for each individual and family but will share some of the same effects , such as depression (sometimes post-partum depression), anxiety, shock, numbness, anger, sadness, fear, guilt, blame, changes in relationship, developing unhealthy coping mechanisms, and sometimes post-traumatic stress disorder and more . These are valid and normal reactions to grief. This loss also affects grandparents and siblings. Let's not forget their grief, too.

Remember self care on this journey. Acknowledge your loss was great and life changing and you have the right to grieve and Mourn .Seek out a trusted friend, counsellor, clergy, support group or one to one support.

Some resources for support are : Alberta Mental Health, your local Mental Health counsellors, Walking Through Grief Society, The compassionate Friend and other web sites for infant loss.

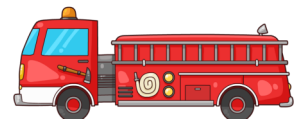

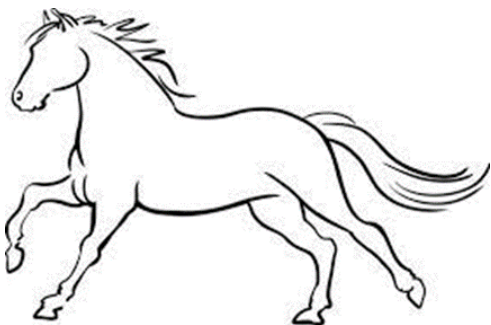
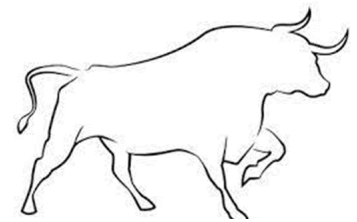
