What matters to you in the Village of Marwayne? Is it our recreational spaces, the need for more activities for young people, the improvement of services for the aging population, the maintenance of our road network or ensuring that local businesses can thrive? If you answered yes to any of these questions, becoming a Councillor for the Village of Marwayne may be the right fit for you.

Councillors are elected to represent the residents of their local community. As a Councillor, you are tasked with making important decisions related to budgeting, infrastructure, economic development and much more. Being a Councillor is both a rewarding and privileged form of public service as you are in a position to make a difference to the quality of people's daily lives and ensure the prosperity of the place you call home. To be eligible to run for Council, you must reside within the municipal boundary of the Village of Marwayne and not have any outstanding monies owing to the municipality.

As a Councillor for the Village of Marwayne, you must: Consider the welfare and interests of the municipality as a whole and bring to Council's attention anything that would promote the welfare or interests of the municipality; Promote an integrated and strategic approach to intermunicipal land use planning and service delivery with neighboring municipalities; Participate generally in developing and evaluating the policies and programs of the municipality; Participate in Council meetings and Council committee meetings and meetings of other bodies to which they are appointed by the Council; Obtain information about the operation or administration of the municipality from the CAO or person designated by the CAO; Keep in confidence matters discussed in private at a Council or Council committee meeting until discussed at a meeting held in public; Adhere to the code of conduct established by the Council; and Perform any other duty or function imposed on Councillors under the MGA, any other enactment or by the Council.

The required forms to run for the office of Councillor for the Village of Marwayne are readily available by visiting our website at www.marwayne.ca, or in person at the Village administration office. All relevant paperwork must be submitted to the Village administration office in person by October 16th, 2023 at 12:00pm (noon). The next municipal by-election will be held on November 13th, 2023.

Council Highlight

- Andrew DeGruchy attended the September 18th, 2023 Regular Village Council Meeting to discuss the Regional Emergency Management Collective. The Village has agreed to partner with our neighboring municipalities at an annual cost of \$1 600 per year.
- Council reviewed the Marwayne Public Library Board's financials for the 2021 and 2022 fiscal years. As always, the Village provided the Marwayne Library with a \$2.30 per capita contribution towards their initiatives for this calendar year.
- The Village of Marwayne did not endeavor to contribute to the North Saskatchewan Watershed Alliance.
- Council provided updates on their attendance at their local committee meetings.
- The Village of Marwayne reviewed the monthly utility bill reports, financial reports and cheque distribution reports.
- Council approved the subdivision of Lot 3, Block 16, Plan 0720438 for the purposes of consolidating 50% of it into Lot 2.
- Council reviewed the public works foreman report and regional water operator report.
- Council discussed 2024 objectives and potential projects in advance of the interim budget review and approval.
- The Village of Administration Office will be closed on Friday September 29th, 2023 in honor of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. We encourage everyone in the Village to wear an orange shirt in recognition of the significance of this day.

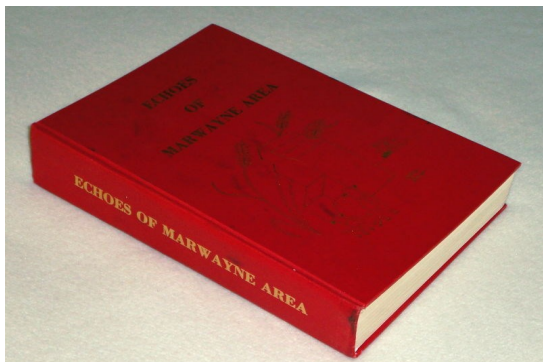

Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day is an annual remembrance day that is observed in the US and Canada on October 15th. The day was established in 2002 by Robyn Bear, Lisa Brown and Tammy Novak, to honor, celebrate, and remember babies who have passed away due to miscarriage, stillbirth, and neonatal death , and other causes of infant loss.

Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day serves to promote greater Awareness, Remembrance and Support for the estimated 1 in 4 families and individuals whose lives are irrevocably altered by the death of their children ,during pregnancy at birth and in infancy.

The aim of the day is to ; Raise awareness of the need of support for families.

Encourage conversation (Every infant is valued)

Honor the babies that have passed.

A time for friends, loved ones and supporting organizations from around the world to join in honoring and remembrance of loved and longed for babies .

Oct 15th at 7 p.m. in all time zones.

A WAVE of light of remembrance begins at the international Date Line , in the first time zone, remaining lit for 1 hour with next time zone lighting respectfully, moving through each time zone as the WAVE of LIGHT circumnavigates the globe. The result is a continuous chain of light encompassing and spanning across the world and around the globe for a 24 hour period, illuminating the night in love and light in honor and remembrance of our children.

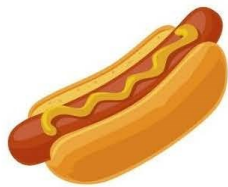

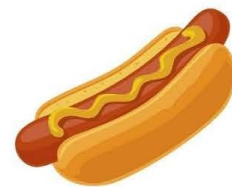

Starting October 13th. We will be starting Rhyme Time for 6 weeks.

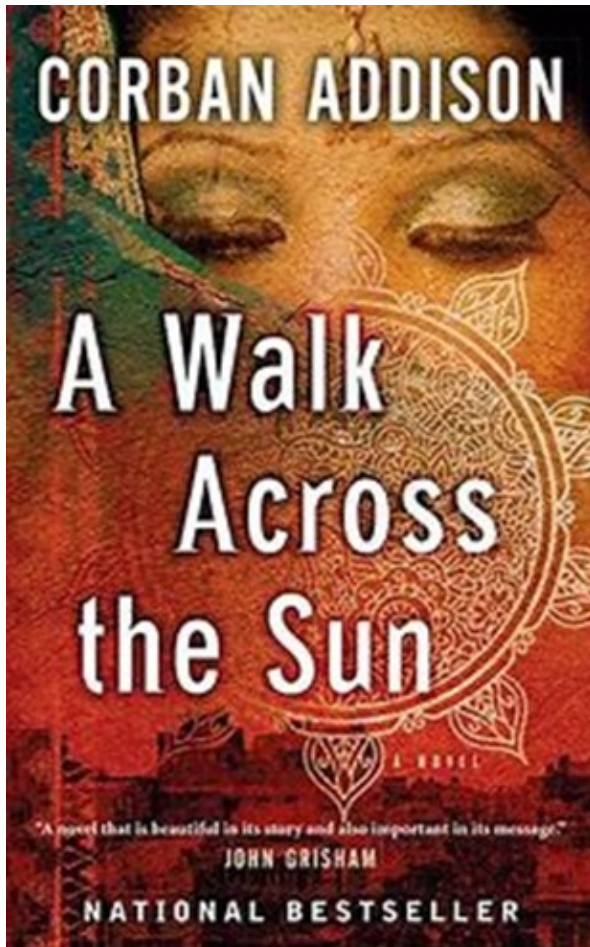
Repetition of rhymes and stories is good for the brain, teaching how language works and improving memory, concentration, spatial intelligence and thinking skills.

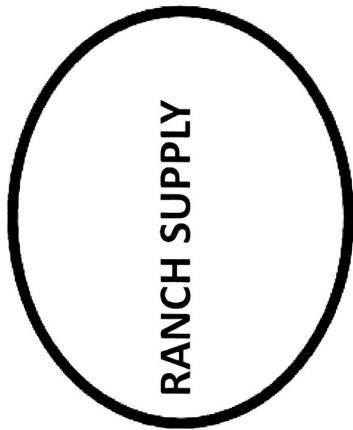

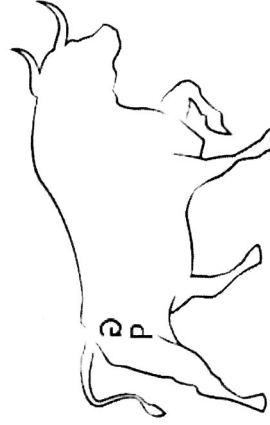
