November 2023 NEWSLETTER



With the winter months upon us, the Village is gearing up for a busy season of snow removal. If the first storm was any indication of what is to come, we are guaranteed to be working around the clock to ensure snow removal and sanding is conducted in a timely manner on Village streets, parking lots and back alleys.

As per Policy PW01, snow removal is only conducted when a minimum of three (3) inches of snow cover has accumulated on our main streets and six (6) inches of snow cover has accumulated on our residential streets. When these levels of snow accumulation have been reached, only then does the Village begin to conduct snow removal on a priority basis.

APPROVED PRIORITY SNOW REMOVAL AREAS

- (1) **Railway Avenue, Centre Street, 1st Street S to the back alley near the fire hall and 2nd Street S from Highway 897 to 2nd Avenue S**
- (2) **2nd Street S from the school to the manors, 3rd Street N, 2nd Avenue S, 1st Street N, 1st Avenue N&S and 2nd Avenue N from the water treatment plant to Railway Avenue**
- (3) **2nd, 3rd, & 5th Avenue N, 1st Avenue S and 3rd Street S**
- (4) **Back alleys, driveways, and the multiplex parking lot/sidewalks**

Further to the above, sanding occurs only on an as needed basis at those intersections approved by Council. All snow removal/sanding on Highway 897 is the responsibility of Alberta Transportation and all snow removal/sanding on 5th Street South/Township Road 524 is conducted by the County of Vermilion River.

APPROVED SANDING AREAS—the school zone, Centre Street, back alley abutments, the curve on Railway Avenue N and the inclines on 3rd Avenue N and 2nd Avenue S

As has always been the case, snow removal on the sidewalks adjacent to personal residences and/or businesses remains the responsibility of the owner and must be cleared within twenty four (24) hours of a major snowfall. We kindly remind you to please drive according to the road conditions, in addition to obeying all traffic laws and signage. We thank you for your patience and understanding as we do our best to clear snow and sand intersections as quickly, efficiently, and safely as possible in the days following a major snow fall.

Driveway Snow Removal Program

The Village of Marwayne is in its second year of our new driveway snow removal program. Our program allows you to sign up for snow removal for your driveway on an annual basis as opposed to a case by case basis. In order to sign up, we require you to call or come into the office, sign the liability waiver and pay the required fee. The 2023-2024 fee is \$200.00 plus GST for residents and \$100.00 plus GST for seniors for 20 minutes of driveway snow removal with our bobcat. Any snow removal beyond 20 minutes is charged at a rate of \$30.00 per half hour. Please be advised, snow removal on driveways is the Village's last priority after a snowfall. In accordance with Policy PW-01, driveway snow removal is conducted only after all of our main roads, side streets, and public spaces have been cleared. Should you have any questions on the program or require more information to sign up, we encourage you to reach out to the Village administration office!

Council Highlight

- Council's organizational meeting was held on October 23rd, 2023. Chris Neureuter remains our Mayor and Ashley Rainey was declared Deputy Mayor.
- Our 2024 meeting schedule and committee appointment list has been published on our website and letters have been circulated to all relevant organizations of the changes.
- Council approved the 2024 Family and Community Support Services allocations. Letters have been sent to all organizations who applied advising them of their allotment.
- The 2024 interim capital and operational budgets are being presented at the November 20th, 2023 Regular Council Meeting.
- The Village is aware of the lower water pressure affecting parts of the community. Rest assured, our contractors are working away to repair our variable frequency drive (VFD) to restore our water pressure back to normal. We thank you for your understanding.

Please be advised that this is private property and not a through road for public access. 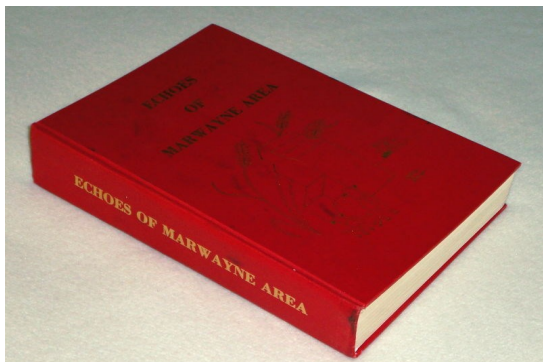

THE POTENTIAL IMPACT OF CRISIS

Having experiences of crisis comes to most people at some point in their lives. One definition of crisis describes it as a time of intense difficulty, trouble, or danger. These times may come as isolated events, in cycled experiences, or as longer sustained experiences.

One potential experience of cycled crisis is what may be experienced during instances of family violence. November is Family Violence Prevention Month, which further highlights the importance of having conversations and being aware of the crises that family violence can create in peoples' lives. Additionally, November brings focus to sustained experiences of crisis, such as for those who have endured wars and battles throughout history and in current times. With Remembrance Day, we remember those who have historically or who continue to experience crisis on a daily basis as needed to bravely serve our country.

When a crisis is experienced, each person may respond in a different and unique way, which largely depends on their personality, support systems, and coping skills. Crisis can lead to a variety of potential emotional responses, such as, fear, anger, anxiety, and helplessness. It can also put into action the natural "fight-or-flight" response. If experienced for an extended period, the sustained impact of living in "fight-or-flight" or "crisis mode" may affect our mental health and how we cope on a daily basis.

Crisis can change our lives, our trust, our security, and often, our world assumptions are challenged. We may question whether what we are experiencing is "normal." We might grieve due to experiencing a loss of normalcy, relationships, safety, and security.

Though it may be difficult to find, there is hope that can be found through crisis. We can reach out and seek support to help us develop strong coping skills and build resilience. Below are a few ideas of skills in resilience that can be helpful to learn during times of crisis:

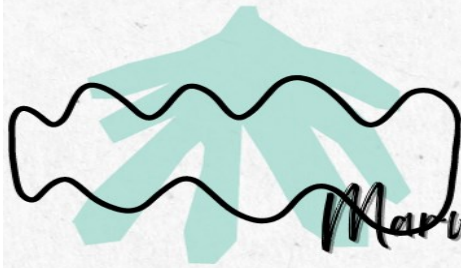
- Learning about perceptiveness: You understand people and situations and are able to question what is happening in your family or community.
- Practicing service: You give of yourself to others, which can support you in finding hope.
- Seeking independence as needed: You can separate yourself from perspectives or other people who may not be helpful to you to become more confident in making your way through the crisis.
- Discovering optimism: You find hope for a bright future for yourself and the world.
- Finding connection: You can seek out support from others and form caring and positive relationships.
- Building self motivation: You have the drive to fulfill your dreams and goals.
- Practicing creativity: You can express your experiences in a constructive and helpful way.
- Exploring spirituality: You have faith in someone greater than yourself.
- Finding your sense of humour: You can see the funny side of the world and your circumstances, and use this ability to put things into perspective.

To learn these skills, we can seek out counsellors, health professionals, support groups, or support persons in our communities. We do not have to feel alone in our experiences of crisis.

The Gun 10k by Shoot-A-Way is a basketball shooting machine to dramatically improve players' shots. This basketball shooting machine will act as an automatic rebounder, instantly rebounding a made or missed shot and giving a direct return pass for another shot. Fires up to 1800 shots per hour and can work with up to 12 players to get an intense workout in a short time.

We hope that this machine will support the development of our basketball teams and gym classes for many years to come.
