Underground infrastructure and road construction are well underway with Rusway replacing underground water lines on Railway Avenue and ASL to follow to complete the paving.

ASL is also busy at work milling and paving to complete the road overlay projects on 2nd Street South and 3rd Street North.

Once the overlay is complete, speed bumps will be added along 3rd Street, as per our community survey, to assist in reducing the speed of drivers coming into town from the County of Vermilion River.

During this time, Railway Avenue will have little, if any, road access with detours set in place. There is continued access to businesses that are located on Railway via sidewalk. Additionally, there is also a current parking ban on 3rd Street North to allow ASL the space to complete their projects.

We ask that everyone gives the crews plenty of room to work and we sincerely appreciate everyone's



Council Meeting Highlights

• The Village Council approved the amendment to the Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 601-27. A copy of this Bylaw can be found on the Village Website.

• The County of Vermilion River is seeking to apply for an ACP grant for economic development as a benefit to our region. This would cover the Villages of Marwayne, Kitscoty and Paradise Valley.

• ASL Paving began Milling on September 10th in order to complete the road overlay projects on 2nd Street and 3rd Street. Once the overlay is complete, speed bumps will be added along 3rd Street, as per our community survey, to assist in reducing the speed of drivers coming into town from the County.

 \cdot Rusway has begun underground roadwork on Railway Ave as of September 23, 2024. During this time there will be limited, if any, access with alternate detours in place.

• Administration is currently working on the 2025 interim budget for presentation at the October Regular Council Meeting.

 \cdot Metrix Group will be scheduling a date to complete the interim audit testing in November.

• Alberta Municipal Affairs announce a \$500,000 in grant funding for 2025 Fire Services Training Program.

 \cdot Council has accepted the presented Northern Lights Library System 2025 Budget. The total levy for the Village of Marwayne is calculated at \$5.47 per capita.







Jesus still calls us, "Come to me." Thank God, Happy Thanksgiving!!



HIDDEN GRIEF

October 15th is National Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Day. This encourages us to set time aside to remember and support families who have experienced the pain and grief of miscarriage, stillbirth, and infant loss due to SIDS and other causes. This is a time to remember the loss that took a gift and treasure, far too soon. A time to remember the hopes, dreams, and future that will not look the same. Unfortunately, this is often a time that remembering becomes a lonely journey and people are left to endure a hidden grief. Many do not know how to understand the grief and therefore feel uncomfortable with knowing how to support grieving families. There often is a stigma around the loss of someone the community never got to know and those who have suffered such a great loss may feel that they don't have a right to grieve. October 15th encourages us to become aware of those who grieve and seek to understand the impact of such a loss for parents, siblings, families, and friends.

For you the parents, we honour you as you remember the anticipation of being a parent to now having empty arms. This has become the beginning of an emotional roller coaster that may find you experiencing anger, fear, guilt, blame, depression, and anxiety among other emotions. You have experienced one of life's greatest losses and you are allowed to share your grief with others and break away from a hidden or lonely experience. Your grief will take time to work through and it is a journey you can navigate by considering some of the following:

- Take care of yourself: Eat well and get plenty of rest so you can continue to heal emotionally.
- Express yourself in a way that fits who you are: Find a safe person to talk about your feelings, fears, and your grief. Journal or find a special project that has meaning for you. This can be a release for the bottled feelings inside.
- Explore available resources: There are books, articles, poems, music, and support groups available.

• Build your support network: It may be family and friends or a faith community. You may want to contact a support group for parents who have had similar loss to be able to share your story and learn from others about their coping skills.

Try to be understanding of your partners' needs: There may be times it is difficult to comfort each other. Be sensitive to their needs and find others you can lean on in difficult times helps. On October 15th, light a candle in remembrance of so many who have lost so much. There is something special about light. It can help us see past darkness and can give hope in that darkness that there is a future.
