#### Lifetime Pet Licensing



#### ABOUT THE CHANGE

The Village of Marwayne will be implementing Lifetime Pet Licenses effective January 1, 2025. This change comes as a result of the fact that the Lloydminster Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) is often at capacity and the Village has no where to bring stray dogs and cats at large within the community. With the colder weather upon us, we want to be able to reunite animals with their respective owners as quickly as possible and avoid the risk of any animal being denied care by the SPCA and released as a result. Unfortunately, the Village of Marwayne is not able to care for, or provide temporary shelter for, any animal that is found at large and turned away by the Lloydminster SPCA. We are hopeful that the implementation of a lifetime pet license will encourage a larger portion of our residents to register their animals so that no dog or cat is left outside without the care and attention they deserve this winter and beyond.

Simply fill out the pet licensing form with a **one time pet licensing fee of \$40** and return to the Village office no later than January 31, 2025. Forms and pet licensing information can be found on the Village of Marwayne website or can be picked up at the Village Administration Office during regular business hours (Tuesday through Thursday 8:00-4:30pm).

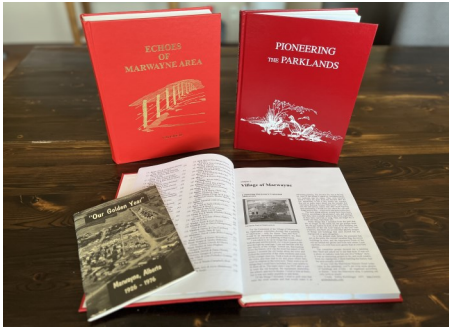
## Council Meeting Highlights

- Council's organizational meeting was held on October 21st, 2024. Chris Neureuter remains our Mayor and Ashley Rainey remains our Deputy Mayor.
- Our 2025 Council meeting schedule and internal/external committee appointment lists have been published on our website and letters have been circulated to all relevant organizations of any changes.
- Council approved the 2025 Family and Community Support Services allocations. Letters have been sent to all organizations who applied advising them of their allotment.
- Council approved the lifetime pet licensing program effective January 1st, 2025. Residents will now be able to purchase a pet license that does not expire in hopes of alleviating the amount of animals turned into the SPCA or living at large.
- Rusway Construction has completed water main repairs on Railway Avenue as of October 1st, 2024. W&R Concrete has replaced the sidewalk from Centre Street down to the Liquor Store.
- ASL has completed paving on 2nd St South and has started paving work on Railway Ave and 3rd St North. The paving is scheduled to wrap up before the 2nd week of November, weather permitting.
- All personal property stored on Municipal Land has been accounted for and will need to be renewed again in 2025.

## Snow Removal Program

The Village of Marwayne's snow removal program allows you to sign up for snow removal for your driveway on an annual basis. In order to sign up, we require you to call or come into the office, sign the liability waiver and pay the required fee. The 2024-2025 fee is \$200.00 plus GST for residents and \$100.00 plus GST for seniors for 20 minutes of driveway snow removal with our bobcat and operator. Any snow removal beyond 20 minutes is charged at a rate of \$30.00 per half hour. Please be advised, snow removal on driveways is the Village's last priority after a snowfall. In accordance with Policy PW-01, driveway snow removal is conducted only after all of our main roads, side streets, and public spaces have been cleared. Should you have any questions on the program or require more information to sign up, we encourage you to reach out to the Village administration office! Please note, we no longer provide one off driveway snow removal services upon request. Should you require intermittent snow removal services of that nature, we encourage you to contact a private contractor. Thank you.

# Snow Removal Priority List

With the winter months upon us, the Village would like to send out a friendly reminder of the snow removal priority list.

As per Policy PW01, snow removal is only conducted when a minimum of three (3) inches of snow cover has accumulated on our main streets and six (6) inches of snow cover has accumulated on our residential streets. When these levels of snow accumulation have been reached, only then does the Village begin to conduct snow removal on a priority basis.

## **APPROVED PRIORITY SNOW REMOVAL AREAS**

- (1) Railway Avenue, Centre Street, 1st Street S to the back alley near the fire hall and 2nd Street S from Highway 897 to 2nd Avenue S**
- (2) 2nd Street S from the school to the manors, 3rd Street N, 2nd Avenue S, 1st Street N, 1st Avenue N&S and 2nd Avenue N from the water treatment plant to Railway Avenue**
- (3) 2nd, 3rd, & 5th Avenue N, 1st Avenue S and 3rd Street S**
- (4) Back alleys, driveways, and the multiplex parking lot/sidewalks**

Further to the above, sanding occurs only on an as needed basis at those intersections approved by Council. All snow removal/sanding on Highway 897 is the responsibility of Alberta Transportation and all snow removal/sanding on 5th Street South/Township Road 524 is conducted by the County of Vermilion River.

## **APPROVED SANDING AREAS—the school zone, Centre Street, back alley abutments, the curve on Railway Avenue N and the inclines on 3rd Avenue N and 2nd Avenue S**

As has always been the case, snow removal on the sidewalks adjacent to personal residences and/or businesses remains the responsibility of the owner and must be cleared within twenty four (24) hours of a major snowfall. We kindly remind you to please drive according to the road conditions, in addition to obeying all traffic laws and signage. We thank you for your patience and understanding as we do our best to clear snow and sand intersections as quickly, efficiently, and safely as possible in the days following a major snow fall.

## MUSIC AND GRIEF

"Music speaks to my soul in a way words cannot. Music speaks of my pain, expresses my joy, and shares my memories. Through music the emotions of grief are shared in beautiful rhythms and soothing words" - Tanya Lord

As we walk through grief, we may often find ourselves feeling stuck or trapped in our emotions. One way to help navigate and continue on the path is to find different ways of coping and understanding our grief. Music can offer an important avenue for healing. Here are a few ways music can help:

Music can help us to honour our loved ones. Some people may attend funerals or celebrations of life for their loved ones. Music is often found in these settings and is often chosen intentionally as a way of honouring the individual by collectively listening to the music with those who are showing respect and remembrance to our loved one.

Music can bring up important memories of our loved ones. Whether you are choosing a song, or it happens to come on the radio, it might bring up reminders of times we spent with our loved ones. Hearing these songs might transport you back in time to important memories that can allow for reflection, which can aid in your grief.

Music can offer creativity to our grieving process. If you are someone who enjoys playing an instrument or song writing, it may be helpful to find the strength to pick up your instrument or a pen again. Creating music can give us an opportunity to make sense of our grief.

Music can provide us opportunities to capture our grief within the confines of a three minute song. When we listen to a song, we know that there is always a start, a middle, and an end. This can be powerful because we it provides us a set time to feel the emotions that a song might bring up. We know that the song will eventually end, and that we are allowed to move through our grief as we listen to the song. We can always set the song on repeat if we need a little more time.

Music reminds us of the common humanity of grief. As humans, we will all have times of grieving. Many musicians have found ways of expressing their grieving experience through their music. When we listen to their songs, we may find a new way of understanding our grief by connecting with the words the musician has used to express their own grief. This can help us to feel less alone.

Take some time to reflect on how music may help you in your grief journey. You may even want to create a special playlist to support your process or connect with streaming services that can share playlists created by other people walking similar paths. By adding new coping strategies, you can take important steps in healing while always remembering your loved ones.

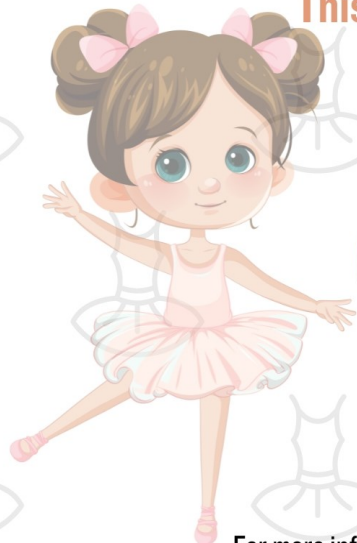

Marwayne Ag Society's Task Force is a dedicated group of individuals overseeing the Agriplex Improvement Project and they are seeking support for improvements to both the Arena and Curling Rink. 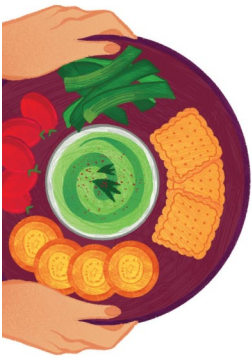
